1 | Teys Bros



Teys Bros is the largest Australian-owned meat processing company. It was created out of the joint venture of the Teys and Packer families.

The company was originally formed by a partnership between the four Teys brothers in 1946.

Today the company processes more than 4,400 head per day with a turnover of \$1.2 billion per year and employs in excess of 2,800 staff.

Teys Bros comprises of four processing plants, a 30,000-head feedlot, a tannery and a value-adding business.

The company's main aims are maintaining core principles of food safety and customer satisfaction carried out by well-trained staff. Reinvestment to maintain the high standard of technology that the company has achieved in its plants is paramount to its success.

Teys Bros places great emphases on being a good corporate citizen and has a commitment to minimise any impact on the environment.

While it is a modern corporation it continues to follow the family principles of honesty, loyalty and integrity.

2 | Hutchinson Builders

Hutchinson Builders is Queensland's largest privately-owned building company.

Hutchies, as it is affectionately named by staff and industry, is a family company which has been known and respected within the State's building scene for four generations.
